Conference chair

Keynote speakers

Conference themes

The conference was organized around 4 topics that had been central in social and organizational psychology in the previous couple of years. Each theme was organized and chaired by two theme chairs.

- 3. "Body and Mind: Interfacing Affect, Cognition, Perception, Action, and Bodily States" Chair: dr. Ruud Custers (Utrecht University) and prof.dr. Gün Semin (Utrecht University)
- 4. "The Vice and Virtue of Diversity" Chair: prof.dr. Naomi Ellemers (Leiden University) and dr. Bernard Nijstad (University of Amsterdam)

In each conference theme, speakers from all tracks of the KLI presented their research. The goal of this overarching approach was to stimulate fruitful discussions and exchanges that bridge the different tracks and shed new light on the topics by combining and integrating perspectives from different levels of analysis (i.e., intrapersonal, interpersonal, group and organization, and intergroup).
